

**WOODLANDS COUNTY  
BYLAW 432/14**

**PROVINCE OF ALBERTA**

**A BYLAW BEING ENACTED FOR THE REGULATING, CONTROLLING AND  
CONFINEMENT OF DOGS WITHIN WOODLANDS COUNTY**

**WHEREAS** the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26 and amendments thereto, provides authority to pass bylaws to regulate the safety, health and welfare of people and the protection of people, property, and, wild and domestic animals and activities in relation to them; and with relation to the enforcement of those bylaws create offences, set fees and impose fines;

**AND WHEREAS** the Provincial Offences Procedure Act and amendments made thereto provide authority for a Council of a municipality to, by bylaw, provide for the payment of violation tickets or summons out of Court,

**AND WHEREAS** the Council of Woodlands County deems it necessary and in the best interest of the public and residents of Woodlands County to provide for the regulating, controlling and confinement of dogs "Running at Large", the "Licensing" and "Nuisance" of dogs within the boundaries of Woodlands County.

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of Woodlands County, duly assembled, enacts as follows:

- 1) This Bylaw may be cited as "The Woodlands County Dog Bylaw" and is in effect for areas listed in Schedule "E".
- 2) **Definitions**
  - a) "Council" shall mean the Council of Woodlands County;
  - b) "County" shall mean Woodlands County as established by Order in Council 780/93;
  - c) "Controlled Confinement" shall mean when a dog is confined in a pen, cage or building or securely tethered in a manner that will not allow the animal to bite or harm any person or animal.
  - d) "Dangerous Dog" shall include any dog that has been the subject of a conviction, of an offence under Section 4 of this bylaw and/or in the opinion of the Bylaw Officer, shows serious signs of aggression towards the public or Bylaw Officer and puts the public or Bylaw Officer in a position of serious physical harm;
  - e) "Dog" shall mean either male or female of any canine breed;

- f)** “Bylaw Officer” shall mean any member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or a County Peace Officer or Bylaw Enforcement Officer or any person appointed by Woodlands County Council or under contract by Woodlands County to enforce the provisions of this bylaw;
  - g)** “Hamlet” shall mean the Hamlet of Fort Assiniboine, Blue Ridge or Goose Lake.
  - h)** “Owner” shall mean and include any person, group of persons, partnership, association or corporation owning, harbouring, possessing or have custody, charge or control over any dog(s) either temporarily or permanently that remain on or about his/her house or property;
  - i)** “Shelter” shall mean a place or facility designated by the County for the purpose of holding and caring for any dogs impounded under provisions of this bylaw.
  - j)** “Shelter Keeper” shall mean the owner or operator of the shelter.
  - k)** “Running at Large or Run at Large” shall mean any dog that is off the property of its Owner and is not on a leash or lead and under the effective control of its Owner or someone acting with the authority of the Owner;
  - l)** “Violation Tag” shall mean a tag whereby the person alleged to have committed a breach of a provision of this bylaw is given the opportunity to pay a voluntary penalty to the County in lieu of prosecution of an offence pursuant to the Municipal Government Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. M-26, as amended.
  - m)** “Violation Ticket” shall mean a ticket issued pursuant to Part 2 of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. P-34 amended, and Regulations thereunder.
- 3)** All fines relevant to those offences outlined in this bylaw shall be listed in Schedule “A” attached hereto and forming a part thereof.
- 4)** It shall be the responsibility of each owner of a dog, living in areas outlined in Schedule “E” to ensure that:
- a)** The dog is not running at large.
  - b)** An unaltered female dog shall be housed and confined to the owners property during the whole period such female is in season.
  - c)** The dog shall not defecate on property other than his/her own and the owner shall remove forthwith any defecated matter deposited

immediately, from property other than his own. An owner who fails to cause such defecation to be removed is guilty of an offence.

- d)** No dog shall damage or cause damage to public or private property.
  - e)** No dog shall bark or howl excessively in a manner that unreasonably interferes with the use and/or enjoyment of a neighbouring property.
    - i)** For the County of Woodlands to proceed against a person contravening Section 4(e) of this Bylaw, the complainant may be required to complete a "Barking Dog Package" as per attached Schedule "D".
  - f)** No owner shall allow his dog, while on property not his own to bite, attempt to bite or chase any person on a bicycle, on horseback, while walking or running, on an OHV or otherwise attempt to threaten any person;
  - g)** No owner shall allow his dog, while on property not his own to bite, attack, threaten, harass, chase, kill, or injure any domestic livestock, poultry, or pets belonging to other persons.
  - h)** No owner shall allow his dog, while on property not his own to bite or chase any vehicle.
  - i)** A dog shall not upset any waste receptacles or scatter the contents thereof on any property not belonging to the Owner.
  - j)** No person shall tease, torment, annoy, abuse or injure any dog.
  - k)** No person shall untie, loosen or otherwise free a dog which is not in distress unless such person has the authorization of the Owner of said dog.
  - l)** No person whether or not he/she is the Owner of a Dog which is being or has been pursued or captured shall interfere with or attempt to obstruct a Bylaw Officer who is in the execution of his/her duties
- 5)** No person, living in areas listed in Schedule "E", shall keep or harbor more than three (3) dogs of whatever sex and aged six (6) months or more at the same time in any house, shelter, room or place within the County. This Section shall not apply to: Licensed veterinarians, visitors temporarily at a residence for a period of no longer than 21 days, search and rescue dogs, guide dogs and boarding and breeding facilities as defined under Woodlands County Land Use Bylaw.

- 6)** Notwithstanding Section 5, the Bylaw Officer may issue to an Owner an Over-Limit Permit
- a)** Any Owner wishing to obtain an Over-Limit Permit must complete an Over-Limit Application form in the form attached as Schedule “C” to this bylaw and submit the completed Application to the Bylaw Officer.
  - b)** Upon receipt of a completed Over-Limit Permit Application form, the Bylaw Officer shall consider the application, and may, in sole and absolute discretion:
    - i)** Refuse to grant an Over-Limit Permit;
    - ii)** Grant an Over-Limit Permit;
    - iii)** Grant an Over-Limit Permit upon such additional terms and conditions as deemed appropriate.
  - c)** An Over-Limit Permit shall not be transferable.
  - d)** The Bylaw Officer may revoke an Over-Limit Permit if:
    - i)** The Permit holder harbours dogs in excess of the number permitted; or
    - ii)** The Permit holder is guilty of an offence pursuant to Section 4 of this bylaw
- 7)** Every dog over the age of six (6) months shall be licensed by completing an application from Woodlands County within one month after becoming an owner of a dog and said licensing shall be in effect for the lifetime of the dog, with fees set out as per Schedule “B”.
- a)** A license and license tag shall be issued free of charge to, senior citizens over 65 years of age, certified guide or therapy dogs, and recognized search and rescue dogs.
- 8)** In the prosecution or proceedings for a contravention of this bylaw the burden of proof relating to the age of the dog shall be upon the Owner and unless the contrary is proven, the dog shall be presumed to have attained the minimum age of six (6) months at the time of the charge.
- 9)** Licenses issued under this bylaw shall not be transferable from one dog to another or from one Owner to another.

- 10)** A Bylaw Officer may, on reasonable grounds and/or any conviction under Section 4, declare a dog a “Dangerous Dog”.
- a)** Notice that a dog has been declared a “Dangerous Dog” shall be in writing and shall be delivered to the Owner in person.
  - b)** Any Owner who permits a dangerous dog to not be confined is subject to a fine as specified in Schedule “A”.
  - c)** No person shall keep or maintain any dog which has been identified as a “Dangerous Dog” unless such dog is at all times kept in controlled confinement.
  - d)** Any Owner or keeper of a dangerous dog who sells or gives away, or possesses with the intent to sell, any “Dangerous Dog” shall give written notice to the person who will be receiving the dangerous dog that the said dog has been found to be a dangerous dog and will further notify Woodlands County in writing.
- 11)** Any person who contravenes any of the provision of this bylaw is guilty of an offense and is liable to penalty as set out in Schedule “A” attached hereto and forming a part thereof.
- a)** A notice or form commonly called a “Violation Tag” may be issued by a Bylaw Officer, Peace Officer or Woodlands County designate to any person alleged to have breached any provision of this bylaw and the said notice shall require the payment in the amount specified in this bylaw or the regulations pursuant to the Provincial Offences Procedures Act, R.S.A 2000, c. P-34, as amended.
  - b)** A Violation Tag shall be deemed to be sufficiently served if:
    - i)** served personally upon the accused.
    - ii)** Served to a person who appears to be over the age of 18 who resides at the residence.
    - iii)** Mailed to the address of the Owner.
  - c)** No action shall be taken against any person acting under the authority of this bylaw for damages, for destruction or disposal of any dog.
- 12)** If the Violation Tag is not paid within the prescribed time period, the Bylaw Officer may issue a violation ticket pursuant to the Part II of the Provincial Offences Procedure Act, R.S.A. 2000, c. P-34 amended, and Regulations thereunder.

- 13)** A person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw and neglects or refuses to pay the fine specified on any ticket issued for an offence by the date specified for payment on the ticket is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine as specified in Schedule "A".
- 14)** Council shall make provision for the keeping of impounded dogs captured for a violation of this Bylaw. The Chief Administrative Officer shall be at liberty to make such rules and regulations as the Chief Administrative Officer shall consider necessary for the operation of a shelter or shelters for the impoundment of dogs captured for a violation of this Bylaw and may appoint such shelter keepers and Bylaw Officer and such other persons as Council deems are necessary for carrying out the provisions of this Bylaw.

  - a)** Upon demand made by the Bylaw Officer or Woodlands County designate, the Owner shall forthwith surrender for quarantine any dog which has inflicted a serious wound to any person or any dog which the Bylaw Officer has reasonable and probable grounds to suspect of having been exposed to rabies. The dog may be reclaimed by the Owner if:

    - i) adjudged free of rabies; and
    - ii) upon payment of any related confinement expenses.
  - b)** It shall be the duty of the shelter keeper and such other person or persons as may be authorized by Council to confine all dogs captured for violation of this Bylaw in the shelter subject to the Owner's right to redeem the dog within ten (10) days from the date on which the dog was delivered upon payment to the County any fines as per Schedule "A".
  - c)** Any dog not redeemed within the time specified herein will become the property of the shelter.
  - d)** The Owner(s) shall be liable for any related costs incurred for the dog during the time spent at the shelter.
- 15)** That Schedules "A","B", "C", "D" and "E" may be amended by resolution of Council from time to time.
- 16)** That should any provision of this bylaw become invalid, that invalid provision shall be severed and the remaining provisions of the bylaw shall be maintained.
- 17)** That Bylaw #177/04 and any amendments made thereto be and are hereby repealed.

- 18) This Bylaw shall come into force and have effect from and after the date of third and final reading thereof.

**READ** a first time this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, A. D. 2014.

**READ** a second time this 1<sup>st</sup> day of April, A. D. 2014.

**READ** a third time this 15<sup>th</sup> day of April, A. D. 2014.

- The permit holder shelters dogs in excess of the number by the Over-limit Permit; or
- The permit holder is guilty of an offence pursuant to the Woodlands County Dog Bylaw 432/14.

If the Bylaw Officer revokes the Over-limit Permit, no refund of the Over-limit Permit fees shall be made.

All permits issued shall be valid from the date of issue for only those dogs specified above. Any additions and/or changes in the dogs named above will require the permit holder to submit a new application.

What next?

Complete and submit the Dog License Application as required which will form part of this application/permit.

- Fees for a dog license are \$10 for a dog that is spayed/neutered
- Fees for a dog license are \$25 for a dog that is unaltered.

**Subject: Barking Dog Complaint – Patrol Services File #**

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Please find enclosed the Barking Package as discussed your recent complaint registered with Woodlands County. Woodlands County's Dog Bylaw #432/14 states:

4 *It shall be the responsibility of each owner of a dog to ensure that:*

4(e) *No dog shall bark or howl excessively in a manner that unreasonably interferes with the use and/or enjoyment of a neighbouring property.*

In order to successfully prosecute a dog owner for allowing a dog to bark we would like to request that the barking package is completed in as much detail as possible. In order to issue a warning or a summons (ticket) as a follow-up to the barking package, all of the elements of the offense need to be recorded. Once the summons (ticket) is issued, should the dog owner decide to choose the court option instead of paying the fine, this package will become court evidence and you may be required to attend. Details that will help ensure Patrol Services to issue a summons are as follows:

- You must be able to identify the dog and exactly where the dog resides and how you know it resides there. We need a detailed description of the dog (i.e. breed, color, size, sex, distinguishing features, markings, and collar). Can you associate someone at the residence to the dog? Do you know who owns the dog?
- Is there any reason that the dog is barking? We have to prove the dog is barking without provocation. Can you see people walking by, another dog or wildlife or something that the dog may be barking at?
- How does the dog's barking interfere with the use and enjoyment of your property? Is the dog waking you up in the middle of the night, disturbing your sleep or are you being inhibited from being able to do yard work?

Keep a **detailed** log of the barking activity and how it affects you for at least 14 days (should be filled out only by one member of the family to avoid confusion of who heard what and when). This will give us a good look at what is going on, times, and duration. If you can photograph the dog or even tape record the dog barking and record notes of times and dates, this can be helpful. The more information you can give us the better chance we will have of dealing with your complaint.

We are also enclosing a "sample" barking package as a guide to the type of detail necessary in these circumstances. The record of disturbance must be filled out in pen by one individual at the time of the disturbance. The record must be signed and dated by the complainant.

***Remember - by providing this information you may be required to testify in Court.***

Aug 28, 2008	9:30 a.m.	10:45 a.m.	Returning from our morning walk, both dogs howl, bark and bay as we walked by and while we walked up our driveway, but they also continued continuously long after we have gone in the house (approx 40 minutes).
Aug 28, 2008	11:30 a.m.	1:50 pm	Moose ran down the road by the dog owner's property at 11:30 am when dogs started to bark but the dogs continued to bark after moose had vacated the subdivision (Approximately 90 minutes). Saw no other indication of what might have caused them to continue barking.
Aug 28, 2008	3:30 p.m.	4:55 pm	School bus was dropping kids off at the entrance to our property but the dogs continued to bark even after all children had gone inside (approximately 50 minutes).
Aug 28, 2008	9:30 p.m.	2:00 am	Both dogs are by the gate at the road. Loud barking, but cannot see what they are barking at as it is dark outside. Saw owners arrive home from work at 8:00 pm but they have made no attempt to call the dogs in or make them be quiet. Dogs woke my children up at 10:00 pm and then again at 1:00 am the dogs woke up our entire family. Called neighbor but he refused to call the dogs inside as he said they were protecting his property. I asked him from what and he hung up on me.

Aug 29, 2008	8:00 am	5:00 pm	I left my acreage to go to town so was not home to record any barking during these times.
Aug 29, 2008	9:00 p.m.	midnight	Both dogs are by the gate at the road. Loud barking, but cannot see what they are barking at as it is dark outside. Saw owners arrive home from work at 8:00 pm but they have made no attempt to call the dogs in or encourage them to discontinue barking. Dogs woke my children up at 10:00 pm and then again at midnight the dogs woke up our entire family. Called neighbor but no one answered the phone this time.
Aug 30, 2008	9:30 a.m.	10:45 a.m.	Returning from our morning walk, both dogs howl, bark and bay as we walked by and while we walked up our driveway, but they also continued long after we have gone in the house (approx 55 minutes).
Aug 30, 2008	2:00 pm	4:00 pm	Both dogs by the gate barking and howling and I do not see anything that could be disturbing them. Other dogs in the area began to join in. Owner tried to call the dogs in for about 5 minutes but they would not listen so she just went back inside.
Aug 30, 2008	11:30 p.m.	2:00 am	Both dogs are by the gate at the road. Loud barking, but cannot see what they are barking at as it is dark outside. Saw owners arrive home from work at 10:30 pm but they have made no attempt to call the dogs in. Dogs woke my children up at 11:30 pm and then again at 1:30 am the dogs woke up our entire family. Called the neighbor and when he answered I explained my problem about the dogs and their barking but he said I cannot stop them and then just hung up.
Aug 31, 2008	4:30 a.m.	5:45 a.m.	Was awakened by the dogs again at 4:30 am, but could not tell where in their yard they were or why they were barking. The neighbor did not try to call or retrieve them during this barking episode, although I am sure they were home. I did not phone their residence this time.
Aug 31, 2008	9:15 a.m.	10:35 a.m.	Returning from our morning walk, both dogs howl, bark and bay as we walked by and while we walked up our driveway, but they also continued long after we have gone in the house (approx 45 minutes).
Aug 31, 2008	11:00 a.m.	1:30 p.m.	Dogs at fence between our house and theirs. Barking on and off while I was cutting the grass even when I was on the far side of our property.
September 1-7			Gone camping for weekend and a few extra days so was not able to record barking during this time.
