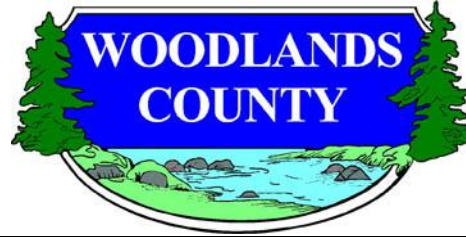


**Title: Dust Control**  
**Policy No: 3203**

Approval: County Council  
Effective Date: January 1, 1994



**Revised: March 5, 2019**

**Policy Statement:** To specify guidelines for the provision of dust control applications to areas of municipal roadways, including areas in front of residences, intersections, poor alignments or other areas identified by the Infrastructure Services Department.

1. The Municipality will implement the use of dust control products for residential dust control that are environmentally safe and cost effective.
2. The Municipality will supply 1 application of dust suppression for a distance of 200 meters in front of a farmstead or-residence.
3. The Municipality will require payment of the fee, as set out in the schedule of fees, before the service is done for the application of dust control product.
4. The applicant will have the authority to determine the location where the dust suppression will be placed, providing that it does not exceed 200 meters.
5. If the applicant requests treatment for more than 200 meters, they will be charged at the rate set out in the By-Law fee schedule.
6. The Municipality will advertise the procedures for dust control, requiring all interested customers to submit an application and pay the fee before the deadline of May 1.
7. Cemeteries, fire halls and community halls will continue to receive the service free upon application. Any other exemptions from payment will require prior approval of Council.
8. In the case of requests for a single application to several adjoining residences, it will be the responsibility of the landowners to work out the distribution of costs. The Municipality will not bill more than one individual or firm for one application.
9. In the case where municipal roadways are being used to haul commodities such as logs, chips, sand and gravel, etc., the trucking firm/contractor shall be responsible for providing dust control for the duration of the haul.

10. The County shall determine the suppressant to be used.
11. The County reserves the right to maintain or rework the application as required for safety and ride ability.
