Joan Slootweg, Manager Planning & Development, reported that there were no written submissions received.

Mayor Rennie opened the floor for verbal submissions on proposed Bylaw 477/16.

Allan O'Brien owner of the Freeman River RV Park advised that he isn't against ball tournaments, however 2-3 of these functions get very loud and go until 3 a.m. He indicated that he has quiet time from 10:30 p.m. to 7

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a.m. at his campground and feels that the County should be able to institute this as well.

Kelly Kluin lives in a Country Residential district on 30 acres with trees buffering around her and wanted to know if they were expected to be quiet at 11 pm and also asked if anyone was aware that grass 10 cm long is only 4 inches.

Chris Redington owner of Reddifast suggested that fines were maybe too low. For example a fine for noise at \$100 could allow 10 individuals to easily throw in \$10 each to cover it.

Lori Budney, indicated that there are quads and motorbikes without mufflers that run throughout the day and evenings which is a noise problem.

Lori Thompson indicated that to have an 11 p.m. noise restriction for ball tournaments and other events and functions such as weddings, family reunions isn't realistic. She further stated that bars are allowed to serve alcohol until 1 a.m. with consumption until 2 a.m. and she would not be happy to have a wedding that had to be shut down at 11 p.m. She also indicted there should not be a noise curfew.

Elaine Dabels advised that she was in agreement with Lori Thompson and stated that we were all young once and need to allow the younger people to live. She feels that the noise control issue has gotten out of hand, that these events bring money and people into the community. She further indicated if people are so against any kind of noise on the few events that occur in the community they should go to a retirement home.

Sandra Dabels, indicated that she has trouble sleeping on weekends during ball tournaments as the noise goes until 3 or 4 a.m.

Mayor Rennie declared the public hearing for Bylaw 477/15 be adjourned at 7:29 p.m. until June 8th, 2016 at 7:15 p.m.
